25 & 26 January 2025: Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C





First Reading: Nehemiah 8:2-6. 8-10 A reading from the book of Nehemiah

They read from the book of Law and they understood what was read.

Ezra the priest brought the Law before the assembly, consisting of men, women, and children old enough to understand. This was the first day of the seventh month. On the square before the Water Gate, in the presence of the men and women, and children old enough to understand, he read from the book from early morning till noon; all the people listened attentively to the Book of the Law.

Ezra the scribe stood on a wooden dais erected for the purpose. In full view of all the people – since he stood higher than all the people – Ezra opened the book; and when he opened it all the people stood up. Then Ezra blessed the Lord, the great God, and all the people raised their hands and answered Amen! Amen!; then they bowed down and, face to the ground, prostrated themselves before the Lord. And Ezra read from the Law of God, translating and giving the sense, so that the people understood what was read.

Then Nehemiah – His Excellency – and Ezra, priest and scribe (and the Levites who were instructing the people) said to all the people, 'This day is sacred to the Lord your God. Do not be mournful, do not weep'. For the people were all in tears as they listened to the words of the Law.

He then said, 'Go, eat the fat, drink the sweet wine, and send a portion to the man who has nothing prepared ready. For this day is sacred to our Lord. Do not be sad: the joy of the Lord is your stronghold.'

Responsorial Psalm: Your words, Lord, are spirit and life.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! The Lord sent me to bring Good News to the poor and freedom to prisoners. I am the servant of the Lord: may his will for me be done. Alleluia!

Gospel: Luke 1:1-4. 4:14-21 A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

The scriptures were fulfilled on this day.

Seeing that many others have undertaken to draw up accounts of the events that have taken place among us, exactly as these were handed down to us by those who from the outset were eyewitnesses and ministers of the word, I in my turn, after carefully going over the whole story from the beginning, have decided to write an ordered account for you, Theophilus, so that your Excellency may learn how well founded the teaching is that you have received.

Jesus, with the power of the Spirit in him, returned to Galilee; and his reputation spread throughout the countryside. He taught in their synagogues and everyone praised him.

He came to Nazara, where he had been brought up, and went into the synagogue on the sabbath day as he usually did. He stood up to read, and they handed him the scroll of the prophet Isaiah. Unrolling the scroll he found the place where it is written:

The spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for he has anointed me. He has sent me to bring the good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives and to the blind new sight, to set the downtrodden free, to proclaim the Lord's year of favour.

He then rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the assistant and sat down. And all eyes in the synagogue were fixed on him. Then he began to speak to them, 'This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen.'

Brothers and Sisters, let us bring our intentions before the Lord, our salvation and refuge.

We pray that we may be faithful witnesses to a God whose presence is in every person and every culture.

We pray that our two communities may work together to continue living the Gospel in our new parish of Our Lady and St Therese.

We pray for a sense of mission that calls us out of our comfort zone to engage with national and international issues where this is injustice and conflict; and we pray for all Christian individuals and organisations who work for peace and reconciliation in our world.

We pray for Nyla, Zahli, Eric, Elly and Kingsley who are initiated into our church at the Sacrament of Baptism this weekend. That they lead a life of faith and love for all.

We pray for our primary school children starting school for the first time. May they learn to engage with, participate in and give to their new community.

We pray for those who are ill especially Kath Maslin, June McKibbin and Michele, Angela & Bruno Maiolo.

We pray for those who have died recently especially Fr Tom Cleary. And for those we remember at this time, especially Joe Ciantar, Maurice Corkhill, John Rodrigues, Cas Lukauskas and Salvatore De Fazio.

PARISH AMALGAMATION: OUR NEW PARISH As of Saturday 25 January, our two parishes are officially amalgamated to form The Parish of Our Lady and St Therese, Essendon. Archbishop Peter A Comensoli's decree (previously posted on notice boards) nominated this as the date when amalgamation would be take effect. Although now officially amalgamated, the parish has been working towards an actual commencement date of 1 February. Parishioners will understand that there is a great deal of work still to do and changes are coming. HOW TO UPDATE YOUR COMPLIANCE STATUS

This information is provided to assist volunteers to ensure continued compliance. This information assumes you have access to internet and are comfortable with computers. If you require assistance, please call our parish staff on 9401 6330, so we can help.

Requirement #1: Working with Children Check

All volunteers over the age of 18 are required to maintain a current Working with Children (WWC) check throughout their involvement with the parish, irrespective of the ministry in which they serve.

A volunteer check is free but only valid for volunteer work. To apply for a WWC check please visit <u>https://www.vic.gov.au/working-with-children-check</u>

It is a requirement that volunteers register Essendon or West Essendon parish as an organisation where they engage in volunteering through the <u>WWCC Service Vic website</u>. The Parish will then receive a letter linking their WWC check to the parish and will be informed if the WWC check status changes.

A teacher who holds a current registration with the Victorian Institute of Teaching (VIT) is exempt from the requirement to undertake a WWC check. VIT, however, requires registered teachers to nominate organisations in which they undertake volunteer work. Website: <u>Service Victoria Teachers Notifications</u>

Requirement #2: Safeguarding Children and Young People Code of Conduct

You can sign the Safeguarding Children and Young People Code of Conduct through the <u>online</u> <u>Safeguarding Essentials Training platform</u> (without completing the training). When you log into the online Safeguarding Essentials Training platform, you will see the following statement:

"Our records indicate that you have not acknowledged the Safeguarding Children and Young People Code of Conduct Declaration in recent times. Please read the document provided below and acknowledge your agreement by clicking the Accept Button."

Volunteers are required to read and acknowledge the Code of Conduct every three years. There is a downloadable pdf version of the code on Archdiocese website here: <u>Safeguarding Children and Young People Code of Conduct</u>

Requirement #3: Safeguarding Essentials Training

Volunteers are required complete the Safeguarding Essentials training module every three years.

The Safeguarding Essentials Training takes approximately 45 minutes and you can stop, leave and go back to it if you need to break it up.

Once you have read and accepted the Safeguarding Children and Young People Code of Conduct, and completed the Safeguarding Essentials Training, the online training platform will automatically update the parish administration system (PACEM) held by our Essendon and West Essendon parish.
